## The Organization

The National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE) was first conceptualized during a 1976 symposium on reducing crime in urban low-income areas, sponsored by the Joint Center for Political Studies, The Police Foundation, and the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration.

Recognizing the need for black police executives to exchange ideas and opinions about law enforcement and their individual leadership roles in policy making and establishing law enforcement standards, participants used the occasion to create NOBLE.

NOBLE is an incorporated, non-profit organization of police chiefs, command-level law enforcement officials, criminal justice educators and persons interested in promoting the goals and objectives of the organization. Since its inception, NOBLE has grown to a membership of over 3500 people with 60 chapters throughout the United States.

## Goals and Objectives

NOBLE is committed to the design and implementation of projects that improve the administration and delivery of law enforcement services. Its objectives are:

- An emphasis on being a competent educational organization that continuously learns from the collective knowledge of its members, and other sources of criminal justice research and data, while simultaneously working to rapidly convert this learning into action;
- Working to ensure long-term organizational stability by identifying and establishing mutually beneficial relationships with corporations as well as other funding sources;
- Recommending and executing policies, processes and procedures that recognize and pursue goals common to all segments of the community and law enforcement, with a focus on ensuring strict accountability and uncompromising integrity;
- Providing structured mentoring programs and opportunities that support the development of NOBLE members for leadership positions in law enforcement;
- Promoting and encouraging attitudes and characteristics that permit adaptability to the changing demands placed on law enforcement and the development of professional communication competencies that help view, comprehend and shape the appropriate responses to an ever-changing environment; and
- Increasing the effectiveness and efficiency of NOBLE through a clearly defined and shared sense of purpose and commitment among its members.

To qualify for a scholarship, students must:

- Be a graduating high school senior accepted in an accredited U.S. college or university or a full-time student enrolled in an accredited U.S. college or university.
- Have a current minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 (C) on a scale of 4.0. Include a copy of your high school or college transcript.
  - Write an original two (2) page (1000 words maximum) essay using Microsoft Word, Times New Roman 12-point font that includes peer-reviewed referenced citations in accordance with MCLA or APA guidelines. ***The essay is to be an original document and cannot be a duplicate of any previous submissions.*** Essay topics:
    - **Graduating High School Applicants:**
      - How will pursuing a higher education help you create a positive impact in your community? Provide a few tangible examples of your ambitions that demonstrate your commitment to your goals.
    - **Existing College Applicants:**
      - Evaluate the statement: “Ethics in decision-making is more important than efficiency.” Do you agree or disagree? Explain your reasoning with examples.
- Provide one letter of reference from a current professor, teacher or another adult (non-relative).
- Be sponsored by a NOBLE Northern Virginia Chapter member.
- Each scholarship packet **must** include a cover letter with the applicant’s name, complete mailing address, cell and home phone numbers, current email address(es), school’s name and sponsor’s name and contact information.
- **Your packet will not be considered if any of the above information is omitted.**
